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1. Short Report Website set-up

This short report discusses the ACCOMPANY website set-up <http://accompanyproject.eu/>

The project webpages serve as a means for continuous dissemination of information to the public, as well as serving an important internal role for knowledge dissemination and sharing among the project participants and all project stakeholders. The website is a key tool for the visibility of the project, and the first place where our stakeholders look for information. With this in mind the project management team ensured the site was up and running as early as possible (within the first month of the project kick-off meeting) and will remain regularly updated throughout the lifetime of the project. We aim to post regularly on press releases, conferences, publications, dissemination activities and other relevant material.

The site <http://accompanyproject.eu/> is registered under the .eu domain: so it establishes European identity on the Internet.

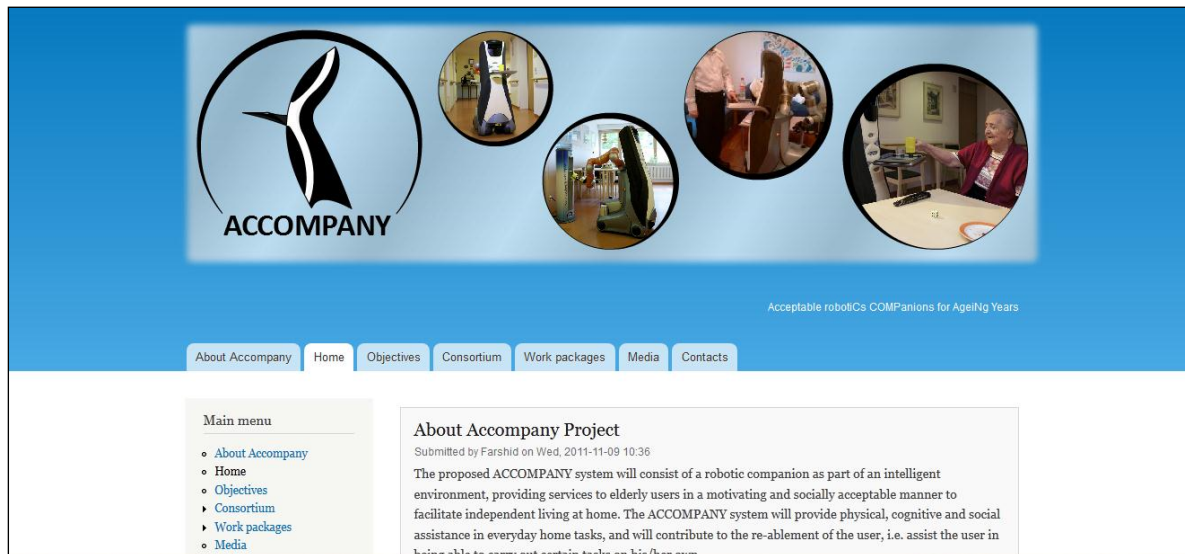
2.1.2 Drupal

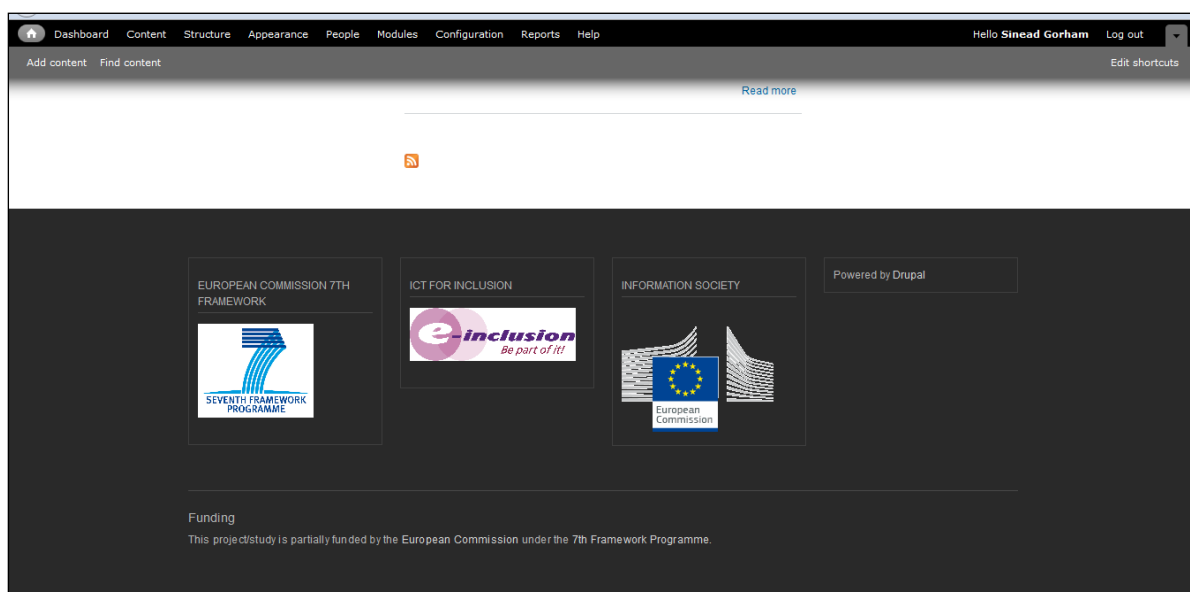

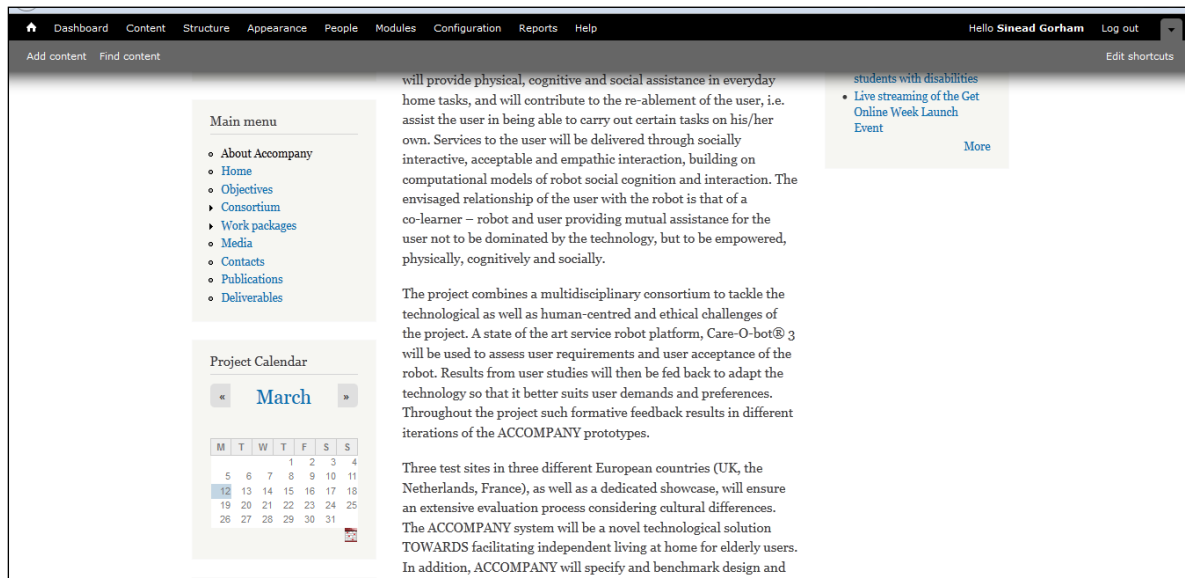


3. External Users View

Consortium: This tab links to individual project partners; giving information on their role in the project; their expertise for ACCOMPANY & listing the key personnel involved (and their personal interests.)

Work packages: A breakdown of the areas of work the project will focus on.

WP2 -Social and empathic interaction design

WP3 -Robot Learning and Adaptive Interaction

WP4 -Environment & Activity Monitoring

WP5 -Integration and Showcase

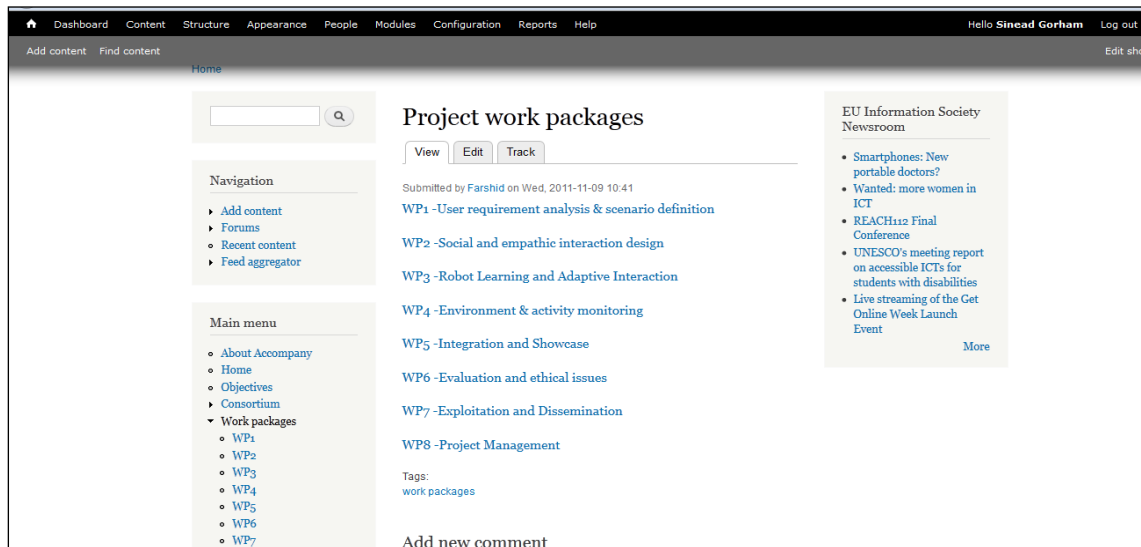
WP6 -Evaluation and Ethical Issues

4. Internal User functions

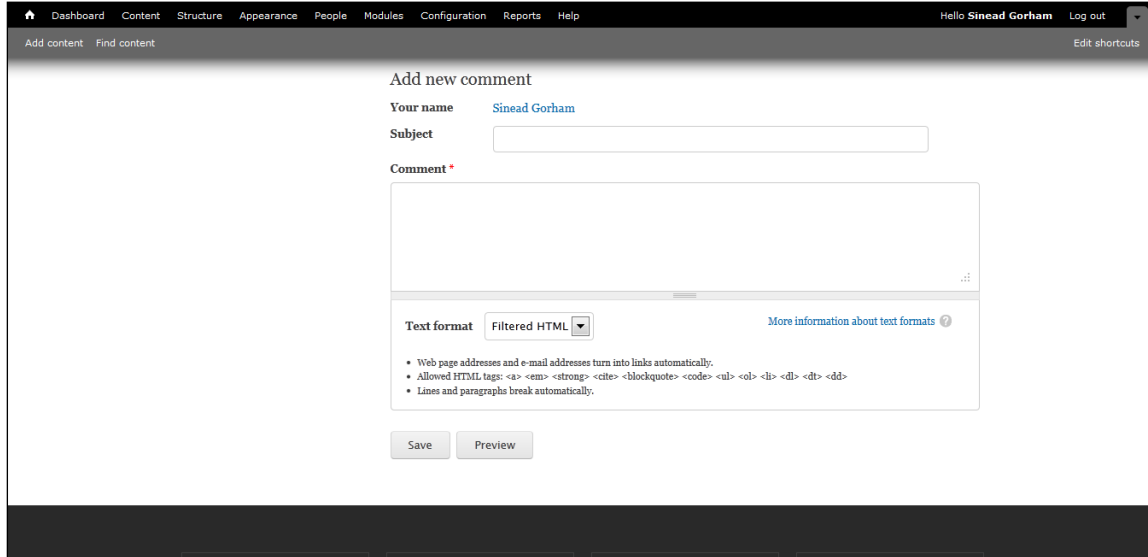
The project site has a dual capacity so that anonymous/external users can register to the site (with username and password) and log on. The Project management team monitors this usage and can track page visits and content added. Once logged on there are a number of other functions available to the user such as:

Forums: There is a general discussion forum for registered users to discuss items related to the project.

Online view: Participants can view who is new to the site or currently online.

Threads: Participants have the possibility to post comments to any current articles/pages.
